#### **Fundations Unit 10: Closed Syllables with 5 Sounds**

Dear Families,

We are in Unit 10 of Fundations already! Unit 10 does not introduce any new sounds. Your child will now be working with *closed syllables* that have *five sounds*. I will teach students how to blend and segment words with up to five sounds in a closed syllable. These are words that usually have a blend (two consonants each with their own sound) at the beginning of the word and a blend at the end of the word. The word "s ! u m p" is an example. The s! is a blend and the mp is a blend. Some words containing five sounds have a blend with a glued sound, as in the word "s k u n k" with the sk blend and the glued sound unk.

Examples: blast, stand, spend, slept, blink, shrimp, stunt, trunk

We will be adding the suffixes **s**, **ed**, and **ing** to these five sound words as well. Remember that your child should tap and spell the baseword first, then add the suffix ending. Do not tap the suffix. Only tap out the sounds in the baseword.

More Examples: plants, crafts, printed, trusted, stinging, drinking

Five sounds can be quite difficult to sound out, to read, and to spell. This new skill will require lots of practice! I will also teach these vowel teams using the Vowel Teams poster: **oa**, **oe**, **ow**, **ou**, **oo**, **ue**, **ew**, **au**, and **aw**. Vowel teams are introduced for reference when students are reading throughout the day. These sounds will be learned in more depth for both reading and spelling in second grade. In the meantime, we will practice them daily!

Attached, you will find the Homework Guide and some fun activities that your child may complete for additional practice at home. Be sure to spread out these practice activities over time as I slowly introduce the new concepts. Please let me know if you have any questions!

- **4.** Have your child write the letters. It is helpful if you say the letters as your child writes them.
